Dear Parishioners;

Today the Church celebrates the feast of the Epiphany. Usually the Church celebrates the Epiphany on January 6 but for convenience in the United States we transfer the feast to Sunday. Epiphany is the "12th" day of Christmas and is sometimes called "Little Christmas." The opening prayer of the Mass tells us what we celebrate. "Father, you revealed your Son to the nations by the guidance of a star."

The Church is speaking of the universal Kingdom of Christ; The manifestation - which is what Epiphany means - to the nations, the pagans, the Magi - the three Kings - are a representation of all the nations. Who they were and where they came from were unessential to the early Christians. What was most important was that they represented the whole world.

This manifestation of Jesus to the world reestablished the conversation of men and women with God. It is reestablished at God's initiative after being lost by our sin. In Jesus, God reconciles us to himself - and shows us the depth of his love for us!

The Celebration of Christmas is also a reminder to us of our need to be generous to those who have not been so greatly blessed. I have seen your generosity in response to this call during the past few weeks. Through you sharing of your gifts we have been able to help a number of families enjoy Christmas.

I pray that the new born child of Bethlehem may reward you every day for your support of this parish and its ministries.
